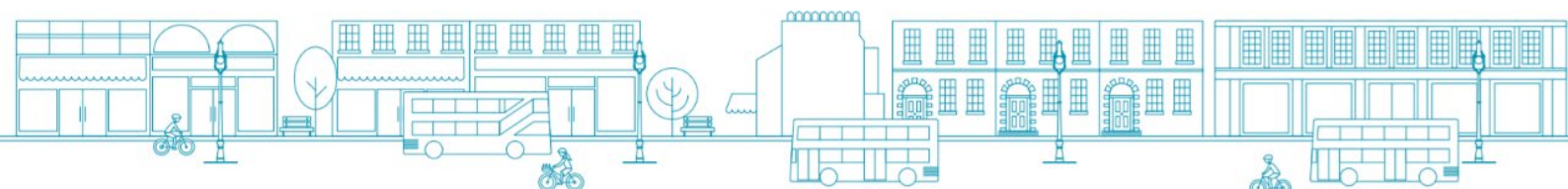

Gower Street and Bloomsbury Street to go two way to traffic

We will be introducing two way traffic to Gower Street and Bloomsbury Street between Grafton Way and High Holborn from Sunday 28th February 2021. This will mean changes for pedestrians, drivers and cyclists. The northern end of Gower Street will remain one way to facilitate HS2 works and we will be in contact again once we are able to make the final full change to two way traffic.

On Monday 1st March 2021 the full traffic restrictions on Tottenham Court Road will become permanent. Areas of Tottenham Court Road will be restricted to buses and cyclists only on Mondays - Saturdays 8am-7pm.

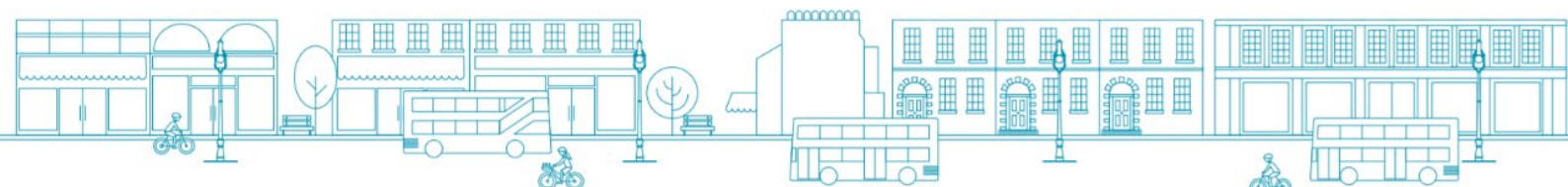
- Gower Street and Bloomsbury Street change to two way traffic from Sunday 28th February 2021
- Two way traffic will run between Grafton Way and High Holborn
- Areas of Tottenham Court Road restricted to buses and cyclists only Mon-Sat 8am-7pm from the 1st March 2021
- Cycle lanes on Gower Street will be open for use
- Pedestrians should remember to LOOK BOTH WAYS when crossing the road
- The new pedestrian crossings are the safest way to cross the road

Advice for pedestrians

- Please take care when crossing Gower Street and Bloomsbury Street and remember to **look both ways for traffic and cycles**.
- Use the pedestrian crossings
- We will have stewards on the street to remind people of the change for the first few days

Advice for cyclists

- The road layout will have changed so please take extra care, take note of all signs and watch for pedestrians and drivers who may not yet be used to two way traffic.
- You can use the new segregated cycle lanes on Gower Street and Bloomsbury Street in both directions. Please note that up until Sunday 28th February 2021



the northbound lane has been open for cyclists to use without traffic – this will now have traffic in so cyclists may feel safer using the segregated cycle lanes.

- When using these lanes please be aware of loading vehicles pulling in and out of the integrated timed loading bays, which can be used between 10am and 2pm for loading.
- Tottenham Court Road will also have areas restricted to buses and cyclists only Monday – Saturday 8am -7pm.

Advice for drivers

- The road layout will have changed so please take extra care, take note of all signs and watch for pedestrians and cyclists who may not yet be used to two way traffic.
- The new traffic restrictions on Tottenham Court Road start on Monday 1st March 2021. There will be areas restricted to buses and cyclists only Monday – Saturday 8am -7pm.
- Signage will be up on the roads to help you so take extra time and care and follow all signage while you get used to the changes.
- We will have TfL staff on site to assist drivers for the first few days of the two way traffic. In particular please note the following key changes:

You cannot travel north on Gower Street further than Grafton Way. All northbound traffic will be signed to turn left onto Grafton Way.

During the restricted hours the easiest way to go north is via Gower Street:

- If you are using Oxford Street to travel north you should carry along New Oxford Street and use Bloomsbury Street / Gower Street
- If you are approaching Cambridge Circus you should use Shaftesbury Avenue to reach Bloomsbury Street / Gower Street
- If you do approach the southern end of Tottenham Court Road you will be forced to turn right onto Great Russell Street



Tottenham Court Road – Howland Street cycle lane update

Work to redesign and reconfigure the cycle lane on Tottenham Court Road into Howland Street has begun. We expect the work to be completed on the 26th February. We will then have TfL staff on site on the reopening of the cycle lane to monitor the compliance of cyclists with the traffic lights at this location.
