

The final change to two-way traffic for the northern section of Gower Street between Grafton Way and Euston Road is now complete. As a reminder, please look both ways when crossing the road and use the pedestrian crossings as the safest way to cross. Traffic is no longer able to turn left from Tottenham Court Road onto Euston Road and should instead use Gower Street to access Euston Road.

Princes Circus update

The work to create a rejuvenated public space with new planting, seating, lighting and pavement at Princes Circus is continuing.

We have completed the set up of the site which is now surrounded by fencing which includes images of what the space will look like once completed. Signage to help customers find the local businesses will also go up shortly.

We are digging trial holes across the site to investigate the structure of the ground and check for any unexpected services as well as removing and clearing paving slabs and old street furniture like bollards.
