Fitzrovia will see Warren Street re-imagined throughout June

The Fitzrovia Partnership, the Business Improvement District, has teamed up with the London Festival of Architecture to test and implement new public realm schemes to improve navigation into and around Fitzrovia by prioritising gateways into the area.

Throughout June, The London Festival of Architecture (LFA) will come to Fitzrovia for the first time. This month-long celebration of architecture will include engaging events and public realm interventions embracing this year's theme 'Reimagine'.

As exciting temporary intervention outside Warren Street tube station will unveil a highly creative solution that reimagines the entry into Fitzrovia via Warren Street. Rabbit Warren Street, created by Able Partners with Elliott Wood, is a fun and bold solution which will improve the pedestrian area outside the station and encourage passers-by to 'dive into' Fitzrovia through eye-catching wayfinding. The scheme will guide pedestrians to less polluted and safer pathways through Fitzrovia and be a discovery of its rich heritage and unique central London offering.

Funded by corporate sponsors, it builds on Fitzrovia's history of pushing creative boundaries and aims to shift perspectives and showcase what can be done with the public realm schemes.

Key sponsors include The Doctor's Laboratory, Heath Services Laboratories, Capital Arches Group (McDonald's) and Rifles Security Solutions. This sponsorship has enabled upcoming architects, designers and artists to develop solutions without the usual constraints.

The launch and big reveal will take place on Thursday 6 June from 12pm, transforming the area into a pedestrian-friendly 'meadow'. Local independent bars, restaurants, retail outlets will showcase their offerings, with playful themed menu items and drinks and local discounts. A live band will be present on Thursday. The street activation will continue on Friday.

Fitzrovia is also a new LFA Destination. The new Destination will be a Fitzrovia-wide celebration with more than 20 events throughout June. Fitzrovia Lates takes place on Thursday 6 June, 6pm-9pm, and is a diverse and inclusive evening of events, workshops and exhibitions for Londoners and visitors to explore architectural practices in the district.

Lee Lyons, COO, The Fitzrovia Partnership said:

"We're excited that Fitzrovia will be a new Destination in the 2024 London Festival of Architecture and showcase our first placemaking intervention. 'Reimagine' couldn't be more applicable for our area as we rethink how our outdoor spaces and public realm can be adapted to be more sustainable economically, socially and environmentally. The creative process of making positive interventions to re-imagine challenging spaces which can then change perceptions and behaviour is exciting and progressive. It benefits residents, workers and visitors and contributes to a more sustainable future.

It is great to have the support of our local council, London Borough of Camden, who have worked with us to make this possible."
